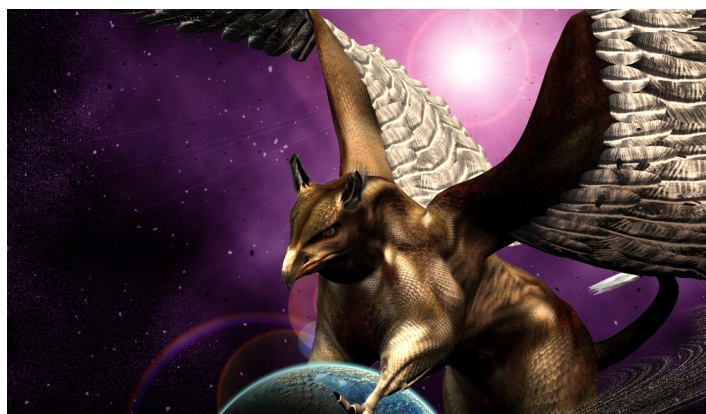

DCO's Note

I recently had a chance to chat with the leadership of another local fan group, and it managed to confirm something I had been thinking might be an overlooked aspect of organized fandom in general.

The least satisfied groups are the most inward looking.

Let's unpack that some. In hearing from others, and observing for myself who is and is not happy with their fandom (and this is not 2nd Fleet or even TRMN specific), from the person to the group to the organization, I have seen that the happiest, most fulfilled people and groups are the ones that are focused outside themselves.

Groups that do things with (or for) others - from conventions to movie nights to just being out there with other people - seem to me to be the most happy or satisfied. Groups who only do things with others of the group have the least satisfaction.

Why is that? Is there something inherent in the idea of participatory fandom that seeks or demands getting outside of yourself? I think there is. There is something in the psyche of those who like a thing enough to join a group dedicated to that thing that demands you share it. We might joke about the evangelical Star Trek or Star Wars fans, or those folk trying to live a lifestyle from a novel, but that is what we have too. Just, perhaps, at a different level.

We want to share, and when you want to share one thing, it is easy to want to share other things too - and that requires you get outside your own circles and into public spaces.

So, if you want to know how to energize your group, or yourself, find something that gets you out into the world, and be part of that - even if it's just seeing movies together in TRMN gear...getting that external activity might be what is needed to regain the joy.



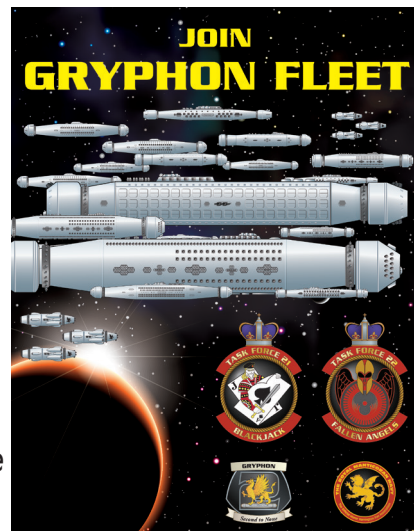

However, real life experience in related fields will be taken into consideration for candidates that fulfill all the other job requirements and bring additional skills to the job if they are not yet at E4. Responsibilities of this role will include, but are not limited to: organization and maintenance of records, proofreading dispatches before public release, and ensuring a uniform understanding of information within the office, and may include any additional office duties assigned by the COS or the Communications Officer.

The candidate must meet the following requirements:

1. Be a member in good standing in TRMN in any branch of service within Second Fleet.
2. Have completed the exams appropriate to E-4 or your current rank (Staff or Line Track).
3. Be in compliance with the "Two Hat Rule" (AO 1602-02).
4. Commit to hold the position for a minimum of 6 months.
5. Have completed the appropriate Yeoman courses for their rank.
6. A functional knowledge and ability to use the Google cloud documents suite, including Drive, Docs, Sheets.
7. Skilled with the proper usage of the written English language

The following criteria are not compulsory, but will be viewed as highly favorable to a candidate:

2. A working knowledge of the Microsoft Office suite (specifically Word and Excel), as well as Apple's Pages and Numbers will be considered an asset.

Bureau of Retention: Make Yourself Heard

Make Yourself Heard! (Confessions of a Lurker #2)

"When the whole world is silent, even one voice becomes powerful."

-Malala Yousafzai

TRMN is a huge organization. By last count, it consists of somewhere around 6000 members on six continents. It would not be surprising to learn we are on all seven; I suspect that the Honorverse would be a good read and of interest to the types that get stationed in Antarctica.

Finding a voice in such a large and established organization can be daunting. There are established members who are vocal, and regulations that have been refined and written in stone over years. For less vocal members, old or new, it can be a challenge to speak up for fear of upsetting the status quo. I, for one, would like to encourage anyone with ideas to speak up and make themselves heard.

My earnest suggestion is that you do this through appropriate channels. Use your chain of command. Talk with your Bosun, Executive Officer, or Commander. There is no such thing as a "bad" question or idea. There are three common possibilities in response.

Worst:

"It's just the way things are done, don't rock the boat."

This is not a response we would hope to receive from our command teams. Keep in mind that they also have real life events to deal with and might not have had time for a fully qualified response. Perhaps rephrasing your question or suggestion to prompt one of the following responses would help.

Better:

"We do it this way because of the following experiences..."

Don't take this as meaning you should shut up and step in line. This is a fair response explaining why things are done the way they are. Your input has been heard and reasoned. By all means, do not take this as a rejection: your input is valued. Perhaps you could take this as a starting point in a conversation. If this failed in the past for reason X, suggest a solution to deal with that issue. One of our First Sergeants back in my Army days loved to say, "Don't bring me a problem unless you have a solution in mind". We're not quite that strict in TRMN, but as some recent events have revealed, the nature of our organization requires us to do some things in very specific ways. There are also certain things that we are simply not allowed to do.

Best:

"Well that is a novel idea! Well thought out and it might make things run smoother. If I can't take action on this, I will forward it to the parties who can."

Bravo Zulu! (Well Done!) You have submitted a question or suggestion that could improve our organization in some way. Every change in this ever-changing world has started this way. Some individual, somewhere, had an idea that changed the world around them.
